What I Learned from the Scribes' Sermons

Introduction:

- A. Matt. 23:1-39
 - 1. What is a hypocrite? Some are accused of hypocrisy when their works do not measure up to their words
 - 2. But that may be an indication of weakness, not hypocrisy
 - 3. "Hypocrite" comes from the Greek hupokrites meaning an actor under an assumed character (Strong's)
 - 4. A true hypocrite is one who pretends to be something he is not, and has no intention of being
- B. Jesus addressed hypocrites, scribes and Pharisees
 - 1. In one sermon He called them hypocrites 7 times, fools twice, and blind guides 5 times, and serpents, brood of vipers once
- C. In spite such strong condemnation, we can learn from hypocrites.
 - 1. We can heed their teaching when it is truth Matt. 23:1-3
 - a. Don't automatically disregard the message if the messenger is a hypocrite
 - b. Look beyond the messenger to the original message
 - 2. We can also learn how not to act.

I. I HAVE LEARNED FROM THEIR ABUSE OF AUTHORITY

- A. Binding on others what one is unwilling to do
 - 1. Matt. 23:1-4
 - 2. This breeds disrespect for all authority, including the Word of God
 - 3. If we want others to have the highest regard for God's word, then we must practice what we preach
- B. Doing works to be seen of men
 - 1. When they did their works, they did it to be seen Matt. 23:5
 - 2. They loved to wear religious clothing that gave appearance of devotion
 - 3. Over time, hypocrisy will become evident to others
 - 4. If we want God's approval, we need to do things to glorify Him, and to be seen only by Him Matt. 5:16, 6:3-4
- C. Seeking special treatment
 - 1. The Pharisees loved special treatment Matt. 23:6-7
 - 2. Jesus expected His disciples to be different Matt. 23:8-12

II. I HAVE LEARNED FROM THEIR FAILURE AS TEACHERS

- A. Failed to save others Matt. 23:13
 - 1. They made the commandments of God ineffective Matt. 15:3-6
 - 2. Their teaching came from hearts distant from God Matt. 15:7-9
 - 3. Our teaching saves both ourselves and others 1Tim. 4:16
- B. Misusing religion for money and prestige Matt. 23:14
 - 1. Elders and preachers can be guilty of this
 - a. 2Tim. 3:4-6; Titus 1:10-11; Acts 20:28-31
 - 2. We should view godliness with contentment as true gain 1Tim. 6:3-8

- C. Made other people worse than they were themselves Matt. 23:15
 - 1. We must be careful not to put ourselves or traditions between God's word and those we teach, but teach them the whole counsel of God a. Acts 20:27
- D. Made distinctions where God did not
 - 1. The scribes and Pharisees made distinctions in oaths Matt. 23:16-22
 - 2. We cannot make distinctions among God's commands 1Peter 4:11

III. I HAVE LEARNED FROM THEIR INCONSISTENT PRACTICE

- A. Left commands undone Matt. 23:23-24
 - 1. All of God's commandments are important Matt. 5:19
- B. Focused only on the outer man Matt. 23:25-28
 - 1. Concerned with keeping the traditions of ritual cleansing
 - 2. Willing to put up with extortion, self-indulgence, and lawlessness
 - 3. We can be guilty of having the wrong focus: big buildings, large crowds
 - a. Fellowship without challenging sinners to true repentance
 - b. Rom. 12:2
- C. Honoring the past, but unwilling to live it
 - 1. They honored the prophets of God, but were more like their ancestors who murdered the prophets Matt. 23:29-31
 - a. They would do more harm than their fathers Matt. 23:32-34
 - b. Upon that generation would come the judgment for the murder of all God's prophets (the destruction of Jerusalem) Matt. 23:35-39
 - 2. We honor men like Jesus and Peter, but are we willing to live what they preached?

Conclusion:

- A. What can we learn from hypocrites? A great deal provided we do not imitate their abuse of authority, failure in teaching, and inconsistent practice
- B. Some people avoid church because "there are hypocrites there."
 - 1. There may be hypocrites in the church, but that's no reason to go to hell
 - 2. Did the hypocrisy of Judas Iscariot justify the rest of the apostles to abandon Jesus?
 - 3. Do hypocrites at a football game discourage you from going?
