

Teenage Dating

- Dating is a precursor to marriage and the family, and therefore it is important
- None of the problems that arise in marriage, save infidelity, can be solved by ending the marriage.
 You are bound for life.
- Most of the problems that arise in marriage are discernable in the dating process.
- "Don't marry someone you can't live without; marry someone you can live with." (Roland Lewis, Home and Family professor at Florida College)



- The Bible does not discuss dating
 - But it does teach principles that guide every
 Christian in moral conduct
- Choosing a mate in Bible times
 - The choice of a bride was usually made by the relatives or a friend appointed by the bridegroom.
 - Gen. 24:51, 34:11
- Courtship in 21st century America

Bible Principles That Guide Dating

- Modern dating has many problems
- One should be primarily focused on substantive, spiritual qualities
- Avoid activities that are a prelude to fornication
 - Gal. 5:19 "Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness"
 - 1Cor. 6:18 "Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body."

Bible Principles That Guide Dating

- How close is too close?
 - Anything that increases temptation is too close.
 - Too often, youth and purity are robbed because our modern dating practices put young people in a position where they engage in behaviors that create regrets that last for the rest of their lives
 - Ecc. 11:9 12:1 "Rejoice, O young man, in your youth, And let your heart cheer you in the days of your youth; Walk in the ways of your heart, And in the sight of your eyes; But know that for all these God will bring you into judgment. Therefore remove sorrow from your heart, And put away evil from your flesh, For childhood and youth are vanity. 12:1 Remember now your Creator in the days of your youth..."




- A difficult environment for Christians: Hypersexualized culture

- It should be treated as the one chance we get for a lifelong partner




- Godly parents can be a wonderful source of help and safety

 - Young people, be humble enough to trust that they have your best interest at heart and that you are limited in your own experience








- Does this person have a prayerful, submissive attitude towards God?
 - Men: would your girlfriend qualify according to Proverbs 31:10-31?
 - Does she dress modestly 1Peter 3:5?
 - Is her conduct consistent with 1Timothy 2:9-15 and Titus 2:4-5?





How To Act During The Relationship

- Be aware of the ever-present danger of fornication
 - 1Cor. 7:9 "But if they cannot exercise selfcontrol, let them marry. For it is better to marry than to burn with passion."
 - The stronger a relationship grows, the more difficult it is to maintain self-control.
 - Boundaries must be established in advance

How To Act During The Relationship

- Where should the boundary be? None is explicitly given in Scripture
 - Matt. 5:27-30 "You have heard that it was said to those of old, You shall not commit adultery. 28 But I say to you that whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart. 29 If your right eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for you that one of your members perish, than for your whole body to be cast into hell. 30 And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for you that one of your members perish, than for your whole body to be cast into hell."

Some Things That Should Be Considered:

- What experiences are special to me now and will be remembered as special later?
- What if we break up? What memories of our conduct would cause me embarrassment and shame?
- How would I feel if someone I was dating had done this thing previously with another? Would I think less of them?
- If the relationship does not work out, would what I have done do harm to a future relationship?
- Will I feel guilt and shame over this thing? How would I feel if word of this got to my family, friends, fellow Christians?
- How will my relationship with God be impacted if I do this thing?
